I firmly believe that the two most important core missions of the Hong Kong College of Cardiology (HKCC) are:

- 1. to promote and provide top quality scientific education and professional training; and
- 2. to promote public health education,

so as to bring about better clinical patient care and quality heart health for the people in Hong Kong.

We reorganized and established two committees, the scientific and public health education committees. We are pleased to get the support from many enthusiastic fellows to join our course. They help to share the tremendous workload and bring new ideas. Together, we make College activities more valuable and meaningful.

As we are determined to make the Annual Scientific Congress the flagship cardiovascular conference of the College, we implemented several major changes for 2019. First, a strong and diversified organizing committee was set up in the prior year. The meeting venue was changed to the Hong Kong Convention & Exhibition Centre, and for the first time, with large LED presentation screen. First also we had the joint American College of Cardiology (ACC) – HKCC sessions, clinical cases competitions and cardiology course for general practitioners. Many renowned international and regional experts joined us to provide a highly educational program. The feedbacks from our international faculty and our fellow members were very positive and encouraging. To plan way ahead, we had already fixed the date and venue for ASC 2020 to allow timely invitation for world-class faculty. We had already secured the commitment from European Society of Cardiology (ESC) to have the joint ESC-HKCC session in 2020. We plan to have at least either the joint session with ACC or ESC, or even both, every year.

The College is also proud of organizing and launching the 3-year Hong Kong Core Cardiology Certificate Course, first of its kind, since 2018, for promoting the training and standard of our cardiology professionals. The first four modules were very well attended by members from trainees to senior fellows. The evaluation feedback were consistently rated as excellent. Participants found the course very useful, practical and well organized, and expressed gratefulness to the passionate organizers.

To streamline and improve the efficiency and strength of our many subcommittees, working groups and chapters, some of which have been idle or dormant with little change for years, we consolidated, simplified and revamped many of those. Most of them have now a new look with addition of many young fellows. Moreover, we established general guideline for a finite term of chairmanship for healthier development and succession planning. These subcommittees help to develop and breed for potential devoted College leaders.



The 9th Congregation held on June 1, 2019 marked another historical moment for our College. Over 42 fellows were inducted. We are glad to have additional driving force to help achieve the College goal. The photos taken for our fellows, their colleagues and family recorded well the memorable and joyful time together.

The College launched a new World Heart Day Run for Heart program. The maximum capacity of 2,000 runners was filled up early. We also promoted public awareness of automatic external defibrillation in saving lives. Many fellows enjoyed the healthy day with colleagues and family. I am glad to learn that some of the never-before runner starts to jog regularly since then.

There are other new programs and improvement plans in progress including ACS in Action, our College website, College journal and Jump Rope for Heart School Program. While there are still a lot of areas with room for improvement, we commit to strive for excellence in organizing training and scientific activities. Whether it is our flagship conference, or just an afternoon chapter meeting, we want the delegates feel the time well worth in attending in every single College event.

I am particularly pleased to see more and more fellows and trainees taking active part in the variety of College activities. We pledge to make the College of our members, by our members, and for our members, our patients and the general public.

Report Summary

Since its foundation in 1992, the Hong Kong College of Cardiology has been continuing its mission to promote the advancement of cardiovascular medicine and public health through scientific, professional, educational activities and international collaboration. Its ultimate goal is to promote heart health of Hong Kong people, and to develop and maintain good practice of cardiovascular medicine by ensuring the highest professional standards of competence and ethical integrity.

The 14th Asian Interventional Cardiovascular Therapeutics (AICT) Congress was successfully held on 7 - 9 September 2018, a strong local committee made up of physicians from both HKCC and HKSTENT worked together with the APSIC (Asian Pacific Society of Interventional Cardiology) to build an enriching and relevant scientific programme of highest educational value for participants. The 7th Asian Preventive Cardiology & Cardiac Rehabilitation of Conference Cum 11th Certificate Course in Cardiac Rehabilitation was held on 8-11 November 2018. It provided an excellent opportunity for sharing experience on practical issues of preventive cardiology and cardiac rehabilitation in Hong Kong. The Cardiovascular Interventional Summit 2018 was held on 14-16 December 2018 at the InterContinental Shenzhen, Shenzhen, China, it was one of the main and international intervention meetings of 2018. The 21st South China International Congress of Cardiology (SCC) was held on 10-13 April 2019 at Guangzhou Baiyun International Convention Centre, Guangzhou, China. HKCC members and spouses joined the delegation of Hong Kong College of Cardiology. The 27th Annual Scientific Congress of the College was held on 31 May -2 June 2019. It has a major uplift aiming to become the flagship cardiovascular conference of the College. Many renowned international and regional cardiology experts joined us to provide a highly educational and exciting program including theme-based symposia, joint sessions with American College of Cardiology, clinical cases competitions, abstract & poster presentations and cardiology course for general practitioners. The College continued to organize the Hong Kong Core Cardiology Certificate Course with the Hong Kong Public Hospital Cardiologists Association as co-organizer. Three modules were held on 8 December 2018, 7 April 2019 and 14 July 2019 with excellent response and feedback. The PCI Fellowship Course: The Basics was held on 25 August 2019 to enhance members' training in PCI. The 13th APHRS & CardioRhythm will be held on 7-10 October 2020, the scientific sessions provide an excellent opportunity for participants to remain abreast of the latest developments in the field of heart rhythm management.

To strengthen and enhance the core missions of the College, new and revamped Scientific Committee and Public Health Education Committee were set up to promote scientific education & professional training and to promote public health education in cardiovascular disease management & prevention. Both committees involve many of our younger enthusiastic fellows. Throughout the year, the College and its various chapters have also organized a number of local scientific programmes which were all very well received and attended.



The College has also actively organized and involved in community projects to promote cardiovascular health. The Jump Rope for Heart Program continues its recruitment of school children for promotion of heart health through rope skipping. A number of projects for promotion and study of heart health in the community were also launched. World Heart Day Run For Heart 2019 was successfully held at the Wu Kai Sha Youth Village on 13 May 2019. Over 2000 participants joined the running competition and the carnival. The World Heart Day Carnival and Global Embrace, which is scheduled on 10 November 2019, will make an yearly climax of heart health promotion to the general public.

Regarding professional training, the College continues its active participation and involvement in the Hong Kong Heart Foundation Cardiology Training Fellowship Programme. This programme provides support for local cardiology trainees and fellows to undergo training in world-renowned overseas centres.

The diversified and calendar-full activities organized by the College would not be successful without the dedication and active participation of its members, support of friends and the contribution of leading practitioners and academics both locally and abroad. Hereby the Council would like to take this opportunity to express its gratitude to all our members and supporters, and will pledge to continue its mission with clear strong will in the years to come.

Background

One of the most important mission of Hong Kong College of Cardiology (HKCC) is to promote the training and standard of our cardiology professionals for better clinical patient care.

In view of the vast and tremendous explosions in knowledge with ever increasing new advances, it is becoming increasingly difficult for cardiologists and fellow trainees to stay abreast and keep up-to-date on core knowledge as well as new frontier technology.

However, the prerequisite of top quality patient care depends highly on core clinical knowledge and experience. Therefore, HKCC determines to launch this first-of-its-kind certificate training course. We are pleased to have Hong Kong Public Hospital Cardiologists Association (HKPHCA), which shares similar aims, to co-organize the course.

Goal

The goal of the course is for our cardiology professionals to enhance their core cardiology knowledge and skill in day-to-day clinical practice.

World Heart Day Run for Heart 2019 was successfully held on 13 May 2019 at the Wu Kai Sha Youth Village. Over 2000 participants joined the running competition and the carnival. The race started at 8:30am, Dr. LAU Yuk Kong, President of Hong Kong College of Cardiology and Dr. CHAN Leung Kwai, Jason, Chairman of the organizing committee of World Heart Day Run For Heart 2019, were invited as stage guests to deliver welcome speech at the opening ceremony.

One of the highlights of World Heart Day Run for Heart 2019 was to be "The most safety running event in Hong Kong", the race boasted the highest density of AEDs and cardiologists. A total of 13 AED stations were set on the running route, an AED station was placed every 350 meters along the track, and doctors carrying AEDs in their backpacks were running with other participants.

Also, Mr. Bob LAM (林盛斌先生), Ms. Nancy WU (胡定欣小姐) and Ms. Paisley HU (胡蓓蔚小姐) were invited as the Heart Healthy Stars (星級健心大使) to kick-off for 10km, 3km, 2km and 800m race.

A total of 270 groups of trophies and cups were issued to the awardees. This was the first time our College organized the running event and the actual participants were far more than the estimated number of 2000. It was a good start for World Heart Day 2019!

Report on Community Activities

Jump Rope for Heart Program (JRFH)(跳繩強心)2018-2019

Around 43,000 students from 74 primary schools, 21 secondary schools and 2 international schools (a total of 97 schools) participated in the program in this academic year 2018-2019. Over 1,100,000 students from 643 schools have joined the program over the past twenty years.

The annual JRFH Inter-school Rope Skipping Competition is the climax of the year, and it provides an occasion for students to show their talents and to exchange skills with others. This year, 60 primary schools and 24 secondary schools participated in the competition on 13 & 14 July 2019 at Southorn Stadium. The competition was divided into 6 groups: 4 groups for primary schools (A1, A2, B1 & B2) and 2 groups for secondary schools (A & B).

School visits by expert teams were conducted in 45 schools in this academic year. Students were all amazed by the wonderful performance of our elite skippers and they showed great interest in learning rope skipping. Besides, 7 anti-drug exhibitions (co-organized by JRFH & AMS) were conducted at JRFH participating schools in this academic year. Very positive feedback was received.

Schools that have participated in JRFH for 2 years or more were invited to apply for the Jump Rope for Heart School Activity Subsidy Program 2018 to conduct heart health educational or promotional programs at schools. The JRFH Finance Committee approved granting HK\$99,084 to subsidize 23 projects applied by JRFH participating schools.

The JRFH Finance Committee agreed to share 50% of the actual subsidy, with the maximum of HK\$75,000, with HKCC to support the "Creative Fruity Venture - Secondary Schools Fruit Promotion Project 2018/19" organized by the Department of Health.

The JRFH Finance Committee approved granting HK\$50,000 to support the World Heart Day 2019 Run For Heart. The event was held at Wu Kai Sha Youth Village on 13 May 2019 (Monday) and it comprised a 3 km and 10 km individual run, 2 km and 800m family relay and a carnival. The event was successfully held and attracted more than 2000 participants. A team of 10 skipping coaches and athletes, representing JRFH, joined the 10 km run.

The Rotary Club CPR & AED Education Project 2018/19 was jointly organized by HKCC, Rotary Club of Hong Kong Northeast and St. John Ambulance Association. As agreed, the JRFH secretariat helped to recruit 100 teachers to join. Among these 100 seats, 20 seats were reserved for members of Rotary Club. Finally, 56 and 24 teachers (total 80 teachers from 33 JRFH participating schools) attended the course on 30 September and 23 December 2018 respectively.

The World Rope Skipping Championships 2018 (WRSC 2018) was held at Shanghai, China from 24 July to 2 August 2018. HKCC and JRFH donated HK\$100,000 and HK\$50,000 respectively to support 139 athletes and coaches joining WRSC 2018. The Hong Kong Delegation was able to capture 23 gold, 31 silver and 34 bronze medals (total 88 medals). The celebration dinner was held on 9 August 2018 at New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel.

The 10th Asian Rope Skipping Championships (10AC) was co-organized by HKCC and Hong Kong Rope Skipping Association, China (HKRSA) and was sponsored by LCSD and HKJC which was held in Hong Kong (Tsuen Wan Sports Centre) from 25 to 28 July 2019. 228 elite rope skippers from 7 Asian countries participated in this tournament. Dr. Patrick KO, Dr. Godwin LEUNG, Ms. Daisy HO and Ms. Shirin LEE sit in the steering committee on behalf of HKCC. HKCC and JRFH donated HK\$100,000 and HK\$50,000 to

support this tournament. Free tickets were distributed to athletes, students in Hong Kong (schools could apply through the intranet of Education Bureau) and the general public in a first-come-first-served basis. Besides competition, 6 booths were opened for the general public to arouse the public interest about rope skipping and heart health. One of the booths was designed by JRFH which focus on heart health.

The JRFH secretariat referred a rope skipping team to perform at a health promotional event on 3 November 2018 at Dragon Centre. The event was organized by the Hong Kong Tuberculosis, Chest and Heart Diseases Association.

Working Group on Cardiac Computed Tomography

Recent advances in cardiac CT technology and their use in the coming generation of cardiac CT scanners will transform cardiac CT into a 'disruptive technology', changing our way of practice.

Latest developments which will soon make an impact on cardiac CT:

- a) The spatial resolution of current cardiac CT is 0.5 mm. The latest scanner has a spatial resolution of 0.25 mm. This greatly enhances our ability to assess coronary plaques and evaluate stents as small as 2.5 mm.
- b) Small CT scanners dedicated for cardiac use, which can fit in a physician's office, are now available. Such scanners are likely to become standard equipment for cardiac group practice. With such easy access, the number of cardiac CT will explode and fuel further development.
- c) Artificial intelligence Autonomic iso-centering of patients on the scanner, automated identification of anatomy, specific coronary vessel segments, plaques and calcium detection will greatly facilitate the analysis of cardiac CT.

Developments in progress:

- a) Spectral CT is likely to be a standard part of CT imaging in the near future. This will improve the detection of myocardial perfusion deficit, aid the reduction of metal artifact, visualize restenosis within stents, enhance plaque and direct infarct imaging and better identify thrombus.
- b) More sensitive CT detector using computer power and photon counting technology will improve image quality beyond current generation of scanners. The low radiation use will allow scanning throughout the cardiac cycles. CT will rival MRI and nuclear scan in the assessment of myocardial perfusion.

Current practice:

1. Coronary artery disease

The ability of cardiac CT to visualize coronary artery anatomy is well established, but severe anatomical stenosis may not be of functional significance. Fractional flow reserve or FFR is currently the gold standard for cardiac revascularization, but it is an invasive procedure.

CT FFR provides this information non-invasively. Leading cardiologist such as Patrick Serruys describes this as a paradigm shift in how patient with coronary artery disease will be assessed and predicts that cardiac CT will replace invasive coronary arteriogram in the near future.

While the use of cardiac CT is low in the public sector in Hong Kong due to excessive demand and a long waiting list, cardiac CT is widely used in the private sector. Most patients, in the private sector, undergoing percutaneous coronary intervention have a previous cardiac CT done. This greatly reduces the number of negative coronary arteriogram and enables strategic planning of the percutaneous coronary intervention prior to sending the patient to the cardiac laboratory.

2. Structural heart disease

Cardiac CT is now routinely used for structural heart procedure patient selection, planning access routes, device sizing and to guide intervention. It has become the gold standard for transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) and left atrial appendix occlusion planning and guidance. In difficult cases, 3D printing of the LA appendix allows different occluders to be trail- fitted in vitro before intervention. This greatly enhances the safety of the procedure. CT plays an even more important role with the more complex transcatheter mitral valve replacement.



In Hong Kong, most interventional procedures for structural heart disease have a cardiac CT performed before the procedure. The latest cine – angiographic equipment can provide cardiac CT images during the procedure by rotating the C arm. When catheter laboratory dedicated to structural heart intervention is set up, such CT images may be pivotal in ensuring success and a smooth procedure during intervention.

3. Cardiac perfusion and CT-FFR

In Hong Kong, while cardiac perfusion can be assessed using CT, it is not used routinely due to excessive radiation involved. This is likely to change when more sensitive detectors become available.

CT-FFR is not available in Hong Kong. It requires high quality images, involves sending the DICOM image overseas and the cost is more than a cardiac MRI or nuclear scan. With more vendors offering such information on site, it is likely to be used routinely.

While CT provides useful information in the diagnosis of coronary artery and structural heart disease and there is a lot of enthusiasm about its use, one must put it into perspective.

In Hong Kong, cardiac CT is currently providing anatomical information only. Such information has to be combined with functional study, clinical information of the patient and physician's acumen before it can be effectively used for the benefit of our patients.
