About the Speakers

Dr Marc S. Sabatine is Chair of the Thrombolysis in Myocardial Infarction (TIMI) Study Group, the Lewis Dexter, MD, Distinguished Chair in Cardiovascular Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital, and a Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. He has led several large-scale, international, randomized controlled trials testing novel therapies for cardiovascular care that have shaped the practice of medicine. A pioneer in the multimarker approach to risk stratification, Dr Sabatine has several National Institutes of Health (NIH) and American Heart Association grants supporting the application of proteomics and metabolomics for discovery of novel biomarkers. He is recognised as one of the most highly cited researchers for several years running, and has authored over 200 peer-reviewed publications. Dr Sabatine is on the writing committees for several US and European practice guidelines, and a Deputy Editor for *JAMA Cardiology*.

Dr Chan Ngai Yin is the Chief-of-Service and Consultant Physician in the Department of Medicine & Geriatrics in Princess Margaret Hospital and an Honorary Clinical Associate Professor of the Department of Medicine & Therapeutics at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He has taken very active roles in different professional organisations in Hong Kong, and is currently the President of the Hong Kong College of Cardiology. Dr Chan is an all-round cardiologist and has published extensively in the areas of cardiac electrophysiology, interventional cardiology and preventive cardiology in high-impact journals like the *Journal of American College of Cardiology* and *Heart*.
